

Arts Incubation Maxt Makerspace



When Peterborough native Roy Schlieben moved back to his hometown nearly a decade ago, he joined a committee exploring the idea of opening a makerspace there. He'd seen the impact one could have on a community, as his brother-in-law started his business in one of the original such spaces in Somerville, Mass.

The idea for what would become <u>MAxT Makerspace</u> was conceived, as it reads on the organization's website, "in basements, event halls and board

rooms" by community volunteers throughout 2014-2015. The idea was

simple, it goes on: people in the region were creative and talented but needed affordable resources. How could he get started quickly and raise the funds and donated he needed to launch the space?

Becky Karush is a seasoned writer whose nearly 20 years of experience includes freelancing copywriting for several clients and magazines, and working for a weekly newspaper. Over time, and boosted during the pandemic, Becky dedicated more of her time to hosting Gateless Writing drop-in salons open to everyone at Nova Arts Block in Keene (every Tuesday) and started a business,



<u>Read to Me</u>, based on this method. She offers 20-plus salons each month (including free online salons), twice-weekly work-in-progress sessions and weekly coworking/revision one-on-one sessions, monthly online writing retreats, and a <u>semi-weekly podcast (also called Read to Me)</u> that includes readings and author interviews.

We spoke with Becky about how she empowers people through writing and makes writing accessible to all.
